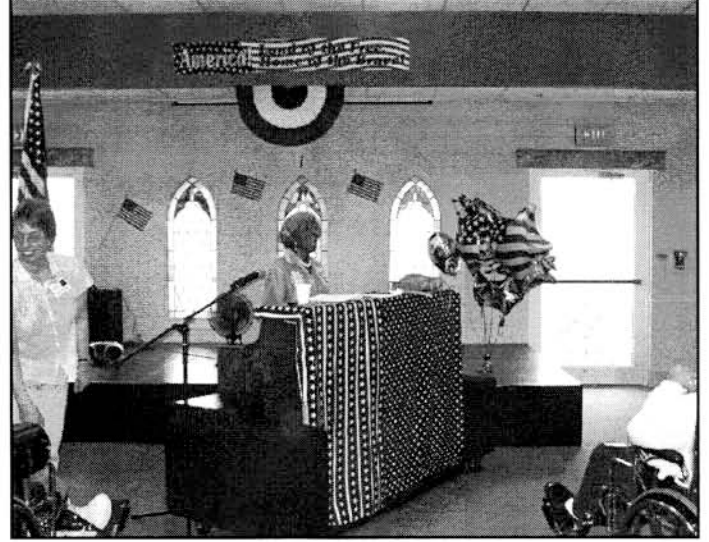


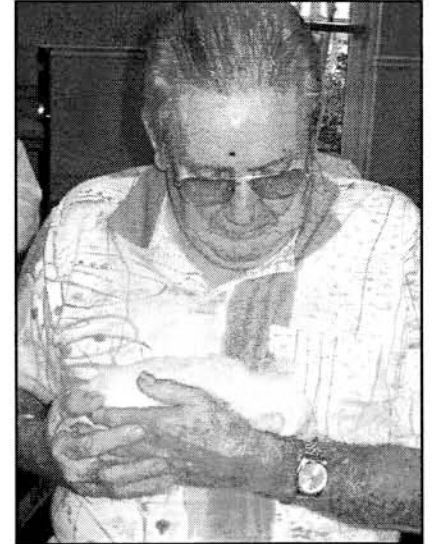
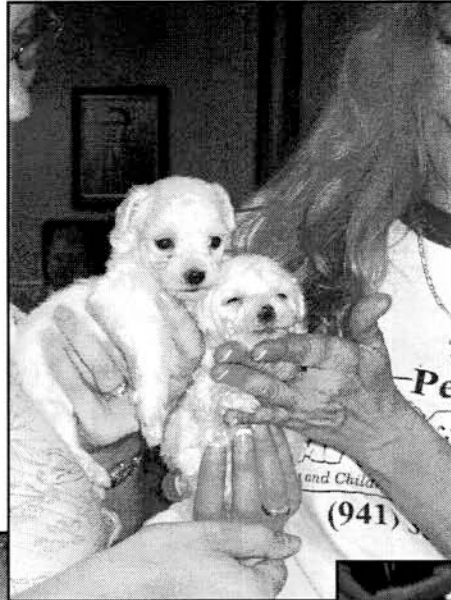
THANK YOU, LILLETTE...

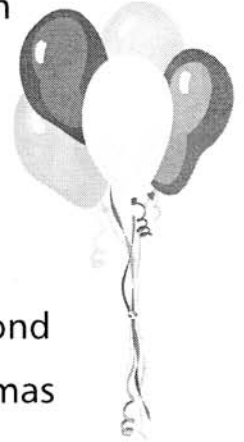
