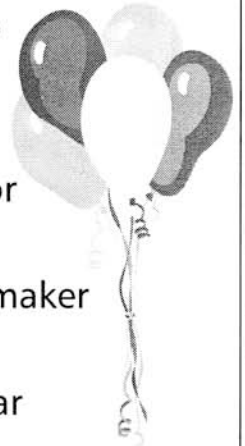

Congratulations, Anna...we 'love you, too, babe!'

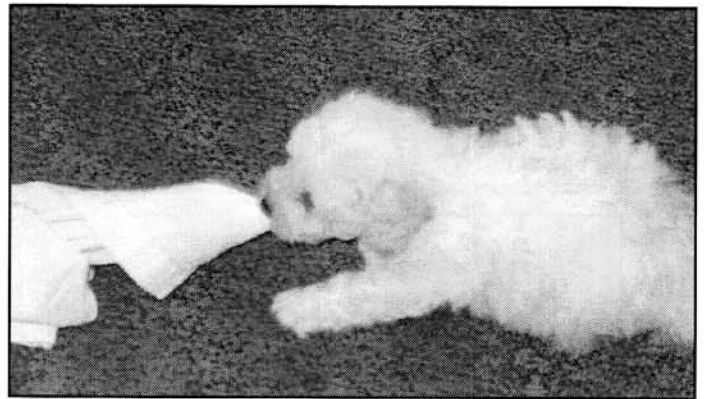
